


A widowed mother and daughter lead an ascetic life in a remote mountain village until their status quo is interrupted by the arrival of a traveller.

Synopsis



A widowed mother and daughter's ascetic life in an isolated village in the Caucasus mountains is interrupted by the arrival of a foreign traveller in need of shelter. His presence awakens erotic longing in both women, who are left to simmer in their guiltyconsciences after the traveller departs.

Director's Note

I was born and raised in Tbilisi, Georgia, and whenever I had the chance, I would leave the city to summit the peaks of the Caucasus Mountain range—a mystical place nestled on the border between Eastern and Western cultures.

During my travels, I knew that if the need arose, I could depend on the hospitality of the local people and knock on any door for shelter. I understood that even in modern times, someone would always invite me in, welcoming me with the words, "A guest is a gift from God"—an honor extended to both foreigners and Georgians alike.

The people I encountered during my travels didn't speak much. Creatures of habit and century-old traditions, they gave each hour of daylight a purpose—there was a time for feeding cattle, there was a time for praying, and even singing.

In this deeply religious culture, each member of the family has strictly defined roles, and the ancient traditions remain as unmoved as

the mountains that surround them.

Naturally, there is a dark side to this adherence to archaic routines, and it will come as no surprise that it is mostly women who suffer from it. In these societies "until death do us part" loses its meaning. Even if they are widowed, women are still expected to maintain their husband's honor; they are closely scrutinized by their family members and neighbors of both genders.

Where Time Stood Still is a drama with surreal elements, inspired by the mountains that rise beyond the grasp of time and the fleeting nature of human existence—by the people I've encountered in my travels.

The story revolves around a mother-daughter relationship that is either symbiotic or codependent (the viewer may decide). The two women, both widowed, spend every waking moment together, and even sleep in the same bed. The film depicts the interruption of their daily routine by a foreign traveler—a man. This man reawakens feelings of womanhood and stirs intense desire, jealousy, temptation, and guilt.

This is an exploration of the concepts of the virtue of action as well as the virtue of thought.

The wide voyeuristic shots, static shots, minimal camera movements, and long takes complement the tone of the place and its people. My cinematographer, Shuli Huang, and I pay homage to both East and West in our visual language.

In an attempt to stay in harmony with the austerity of the characters, the camera remains at a respectful distance from them, only approaching closer when the women themselves are open to letting us in—when their guard is down—in the dead of night.

The film was shot with no coverage, and much like the characters in our story, we gave each hour of daylight a purpose and used only minimal lighting during the night scenes.

I took the same approach with the sound design, keeping it limited and strictly diegetic, until we enter the mother and daughter's subconscious minds.

NINO BENASHVILI

Writer and director

Producer, editor & sound designer

Nino Benashvili is a writer and director from Tbilisi, Georgia, based in New York City.

She is the first Georgian woman to attend the NYU Tisch Graduate Film program, where she has been named a 2023 BAFTA US Scholar and has been awarded the Maurice Kanbar Scholarship.

Her debut narrative short film სადაც დრო იდგა/Where Time Stood Still will compete with the world premiere at 72nd Donostia-San Sebastián Film Festival in Zabaltegi-Tabakalera Section.

Born during the Georgian Civil War, Nino focused her award-winning documentary short, ნიქოზის შვილები/*Children of Nikozi (2021)*, on her childhood village of Nikozi, which was bombed during the Russo-Georgian War in 2008. The film has been screened at festivals worldwide, won Bronze Remi at 2021 Houston Worldfest International Film Festival and aired on PBS.

Nino earned her B.A. from St. John's College Annapolis, where she double majored in Philosophy and the History of Science, with a double minor in Classical Studies and Comparative Literature. In addition to Georgian and English, she is fluent in German and Russian, and has a working knowledge of Ancient Greek and French.

Mother


Tamar Mdinaradze, born on August 17, 1959, in Ozurgeti, Georgia, is a celebrated actress with a background in music and drama. She graduated in piano from Moscow Gnesin State Musical College and in drama acting from Shota Rustaveli Theatre and Film State University. A leading performer at Ozurgeti State Drama Theatre, Tamar won Best Performance in a Female Role for Kiss at 2019 international festivals. She received the Sulkhan-Saba Orbeliani Award in 2021 and was recognized as a *Cultural Ambassador* of the Georgian Stage. In 2023, she appeared in *Blackbird, Blackbird Blackberry* at 2023 Cannes Quinzaine des Cinéastes, and her latest film, *Where Time Stood Still*, is to premiere at San Sebastian.

His first short film, *Will You Look At Me*, premiered at the 61st Semaine de la Critique where it was awarded the Queer Palm of Festival de Cannes 2022, and went on to win the Short Film Jury Award at Sundance Film Festival 2023. *Goodbye First Love*, his second short film premiered in competition at Berlinale Shorts 2024 and was later selected for New Directors/ New Films 2024.

A Chinese-Lebanese filmmaker raised in Valencia, Spain, is currently a fourth-year student in the Graduate Film MFA program at NYU. During his early 20s, he edited six feature films and a TV show, including a Goya-nominated animation film.

Upon moving to New York, he began gaining recognition, winning the Black Family Prize for his short film *Deliver Me*. This film premiered at SXSW 2023 and was sold to Canal+, earning him a BAFTA Scholarship nomination and the Ang Lee Scholarship Award. Joecar was also selected for the Marcie Bloom Fellowship (Sony Pictures Classics) in 2022-2023. 




KOTE JAPARIDZE

Born in 1971 in Tbilisi, Georgia, Kote Japaridze is an accomplished film production designer with extensive experience in both Georgian and international cinema. He graduated from the Art Academy of Georgia with a degree in Film and Television Production Design.

Kote has worked on numerous award-winning films, to highlight a few: Nana Ekvtimishvili and Simon Gross's *My Happy Family* (2017 Sundance Grand Jury Prize) and *In Bloom* (2013 Berlinale CICAE Award, Georgia's entry at the 86th Academy Awards), as well as Levan Koguashvili's *Brighton 4th* (2021 Tribeca Best Narrative Feature). His work also includes short films like Nino Benashvili's *Where Time Stood Still* (2024 San Sebastián official selection) and Dea Kulumbegashvili's *Léthé* (2016 Cannes nominee and San Sebastián official selection).
